2. **Secondary Source of Income :** Production of Crackers, match box, Agarbati, soap, leather industry, pottery, hand made paper. katha and gonda, food grains processing, protection and storage of fruits and vegetables, biscuits and bread, honey selling, cotton, silk and woolen clothes by handicraft, rope, basket, limestone, wooden materials, aluminium, iron tools, bamboo made items, etc.

3. **Tertiary Source of Income :** The tertiary source of income may be as follows:

- a) Agriculture seed, fertilizer, pesticides, tube-wells, diesel machines, wells, water management, purchase, storage and sale of agricultural produce.
- b) Animal Husbandry: Artificial reproduction, traditional services, feed, fodder, sales of milk and milk products, purchase, store and sale of eggs, meat and leather, bones.
- c) Silk and silk made clothes production.
- d) Minor forest produce collection, store and sale.
- e) Fisheries
- f) Rural industries and Artisan activities
- g) Gas plant
- h) Transport-bullock-cart, house cart, buffalo cart, cycle, rickshaw, tempo, beat, and their repair work, purchase of tractor, 407, Matador or minidor etc on the basis of cooperative.
- i) Small business involving a sum up to Rs. 10,000 such as Grain-gola, Pan-gumati, Thela shop, ferri-wala, etc.
- j) For banking and insurance services.
- k) Band party, Tent, Gas, Folk play, Drama, dance etc.

I.R.D.P. is a centrally sponsored scheme in which the participation of Central and State Government in the expenditure is 80:20. In 1996-97, 19.26 lakh families were benefited under it.
